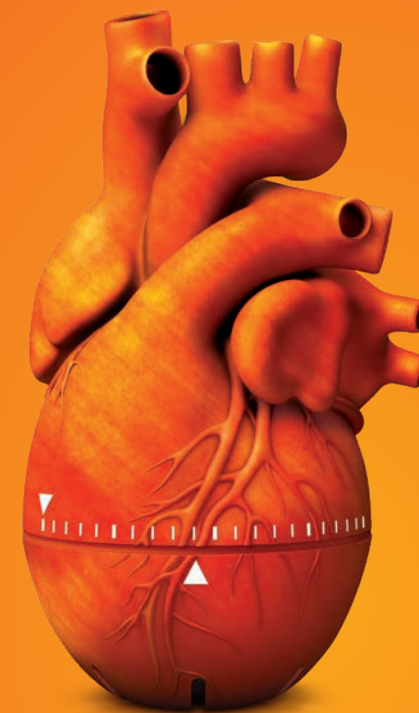

12:45 – 13:10 Pre-operative levosimendan in isolated CABG patients at risk of LCOS

Matthias Heringlake Lübeck, Germany

Following medical education at the Free University of Berlin and two years of residency at the Department of Cardiac Surgery, Schüchtermann – Clinic, Bad Rothenfelde, Matthias Heringlake received his training in Anesthesiology at the Department of Anesthesiology and Intensive Care Medicine, University of Lübeck, where he is now Professor of Anesthesiology and Deputy Director of Cardiothoracic Anesthesia. He is German Representative of EACTA since 2014. He has published over 100 PubMed listed papers in the field of anesthesia and intensive care therapy with a focus on vasoactive drugs and monitoring, and has participated as co-investigator in the recent LEVO-CTS trial.



Philippe Gaudard Montpellier, France

Dr. Gaudard acts as the Medical team leader of the cardio-thoracic and vascular intensive care unit at Montpellier University Hospital, France, with a special interest in short-term and long-term circulatory support and heart transplantation. He is also the program director of the EACTA exchange observership program in intensive care medicine at Montpellier University Hospital. Besides that he is the Chair of the EACTA ICU Committee and the delegate for France at the Representative Council of EACTA.



Wolfgang Toller Graz, Austria

Professor of Anesthesiology in the Department of Anesthesiology and Intensive Care Medicine, Medical University of Graz, Austria. In 1997 he received the Diploma of the European Academy of Anaesthesiology (DEAA). In 1998 Dr. Toller was awarded the Max Kade Scholarship and spent 2 years in the Department of Anesthesiology (Cardiovascular Research) at the Medical College of Wisconsin, Milwaukee, USA. He completed the education to a Master of Business Administration in the area of Health Management. Since 2008 he is head of the Division of Cardiovascular Anesthesiology and since 2013 head of the Department of Anesthesiology and Intensive Care Medicine. In addition to cardiovascular and thoracic anesthesiology, his division is responsible for an 18-bed cardiovascular ICU with adult patients post-cardiac and aortic surgery, adult patients after heart or liver transplantation and pediatric patients post-cardiac surgery.

Dr. Stefaan Bouchez is the local chair of EACTA 2019 in Ghent. He is working as a cardiac anesthesiologist at the Ghent University Hospital. His areas of clinical expertise include adult and pediatric cardiac anesthesia, perioperative echocardiography, lung ultrasound, pulmonary hypertension and left ventricular assist devices. He is also involved in experimental research on electrophysiology of the heart.



Steffen Rex Leuven, Belgium

Dr. Rex is cardiothoracic anaesthetist at the Department of Anesthesiology at the University Hospitals Leuven, Belgium. He has a special interest in pediatric cardiac anesthesia, anesthesia for the transplantation of cardiothoracic organs and in transesophageal echocardiography. He is OR-coordinator and head of clinical research at his department. Dr. Rex is also associate professor of anesthesia at the Department of Cardiovascular Sciences of the KU Leuven, Belgium. He is member of the directory board of the EACTA. Research interests include perioperative (patho) physiology of the right ventricle and the pulmonary circulation, xenon anesthesia and organ protection by noble gases, pediatric cardiac anesthesia and anesthesia / critical care medicine.



Gianluca Paternoster Potenza, Italy

Italian cardiovascular anaesthetist working in Potenza Italy. Member of Italian Association of Cardiothoracic Anaesthetist and Chair of European Annual Meeting of the European Society of Cardiothoracic Anaesthesiology.
